## NEW Education Pavilion

- A gathering and educational place for students of all ages!
- The 20 x 40 foot structure is an outdoor classroom accommodating up to 50 individuals, with seating and table space for 35
- Accessible bathroom, sink, electricity and locked storage room are available.
- Facilities free-of-charge for Westfield School District activities
- Opening May 12, 2026



## NEW Arboretum

- Produced through a collaboration of State Arborists and the “Greening the Gateways Cities” program
- Accessible walkways showcase diverse native and ornamental trees
- A tree canopy that creates a living laboratory that encourages exploration, recreation, and wellness
- Ponds, woodlands, and wetlands are accessible for observation, study, and research



## Grandmothers' Garden

- “Garden enhanced learning” in an historic setting with flower beds and herbs
- Opportunities for hands-on activities led by a Master Gardener
- Seasonal observations of perennials, pollinators, and native species
- Understanding of plant biology and the study of horticulture
- Participation in environmental stewardship and conservation in a neighborhood park
